# **Portrait of the Association**

SAREPTA Suisse is an association, non-lucrative and tax-exempt in Switzerland. It was created the 18th of December 2015 and has as a mission to promote rural health and development in Côte d'Ivoire, primarily by:

- > constructing modern health centers in rural areas
- equipping these centers with quality material
- insuring the good functioning of these centers with qualified staff who are interested in the problems encountered in the rural setting
- promoting good health by campaigns conducted by the center's staff to develop awareness of measures to prevent illness and maintain good health
- > initiating or joining in any other area which would correspond to her mission.

The executive committee is composed of:

-The president: Mrs. Marie-Aimée Päivi Soro, Medical Doctor.

-The general secretary: Mr. Navigué Pierre Soro, qualified at a Bachelor's level in management and human resources, in Biblical Exegesis and Linguistics at a Master's level; having taught English and economics in private schools in Switzerland.

-The treasurer; Mrs. Sarah Seri, special education teacher at the Foundation EBEN\_EZER.

# Activities

The principle activities of the year 2017 were the following:

1. Research of funding to meet the objectives of 2017

- 2. Recruitment of new members
- 3. The drilling of a deep well and installation of an hydraulic pump on the project site

4. Repair of the two hydraulic pumps in Tangafla village

- 5. Construction of a storage room to stock building materials for building of the medical center
- 6. Construction of an apartment for an on-site security guard

This year of 2017 closed with an addition of 5 new members bringing the total to 12.

The plan for the center, created and gifted to SAREPTA by an architect, was revised.

The general secretary made a trip to Côte d'Ivoire from November 28<sup>th</sup> to January 10<sup>th</sup> in order to: - supervise the drilling of the well and installation of the pump.

-supervise the construction of the storage room and guard's apartment.

-follow up of the process of obtaining written permission from the Ministry of Health to construct the center and partner with that Ministry in the area of rural health.

-follow up on the steps toward obtaining a tax-exempt status in Côte d'Ivoire from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

This trip enabled the Association to meet its objectives for the year 2017.



#### The repair of the hydraulic pumps in the village of Tangafla was an urgent need!

During the trip to Côte d'Ivoire, it was noted by the secretary general that both water pumps in the village were non functional due to technical problems which surpassed the competence of the villagers. The population was forced to go a distance of 2 km to the dam of the neighbouring village to obtain the water for all their personal/family needs. This amounted to a health emergency and the association decided to finance and supervise the needed repairs.



The first pump was repaired the 22nd and 23rd of December and the second one the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3rd of January. We are grateful to the SAREPTA committee for their cooperation and support in this urgent affair which needed to be attended to at the same time that the SAREPTA's well was being drilled. The repair of the two pumps was greatly appreciated by the population and their thanks was expressed publicly during a meeting on the 30<sup>th</sup> of December in Tangafla.

The revenues for the year 2017 show an increase from CHF 6'492.28 in 2016 to CHF 32'225.80 in 2017: an increase of 396%. This increase is explained principally by:

-the one-time donation of the Foundation Saint-Paul of CHF 20'000.-

-the pastry sale of CHF 3'172.-

-and the increased membership dues by the addition of new members.

The expenses for the year 2017 are increased from CHF 3'762.68 in 2016 to CHF19'708.94 in 2017: an increase of 424% and are explained principally by:

-The beginning of the projects (well, storehouse, repair of village pumps)

-And additional administrative and fund-raising costs.

## **Problems encountered in 2017**

Like all other organizations, SAREPTA Suisse had its problems, namely two:

1)**The acquisition of new funding agencies**: being a young association, it is hard to instil confidence in those who could contribute. Many applications for funding were sent and the results were the following:

1.no response at all

2.negative response

3.negative response with a possibility of resubmitting in 2018

Never the less we also received several positive responses: a foundation in Fribourg, the municipality of Penthalaz, where our business office is located, and some individuals said YES !This was a big encouragement and we sincerely thank all these groups and persons who believed in us and our project. THANK YOU!

2)**The acquisition of new members** :humanitarian work done as an association depends especially on donated time and talent. People must commit their free time to the effort and that poses problems in recruiting large numbers of people at one time. We did, however, gain 5 new members this past year and are hoping to double that number in 2018.



# What to do?

We plan to continue our search for funding by contacting new foundations, and above all by using our internet and social networks to do a participative financial campaign beginning in early March 2018. We are planning for a fund-raising dinner to be held of the 8<sup>th</sup> of September at the Communal Center in Penthalaz. With these measures, we remain confident of our ability to reach our 2018 objectives by beginning phase #2 of the project (see action plan).

Now that the association has been able to prepare the site for construction (insure an adequate water supply and a place to store materials on site), the years 2018 and 2019 will be consecrated to the construction of the SAREPTA Medical Center in the village of Tangafla. We hope to begin this second phase no later than the beginning of October and finish it no later than the end of December 2019.
